

## Sophomore College Planning

- Take the PSAT in October. Encourage your son/ daughter to prepare for the exam. (In addition to what the English and Math teachers are offering in their classes.)
- Attend College Fairs.
- Get involved in co-curricular activities that interest you, if you are involved. The level of involvement and accomplishment is most important, not the number of activities.
- Continue to keep an academic and co-curricular record of achievements and activities participated in.
- Continue to work hard and stay “on top” of your academic work.
- In mid-December you will receive your PSAT results. Read materials sent with your score report. If you have questions please ask your counselor.
- Keep Studying and continue to read to build on Vocabulary.
- Continue to research colleges and universities. The counseling office has reference materials.
- Students can take practice SAT/ACT exams. (Announcement will be made in December)
- Browse through college literature or surf the web to get an idea of what kinds of schools may be of interest to you. The counseling office has reference materials.

- Browse NCAA Requirements.
